REPEAT NOTIFICATION BECAUSE WE ONLY HAVE 22 PHONE NUMBERS REGISTERED TO RECEIVE TEXT NOTIFICATIONS

We are excited to announce that the Town has partnered with TextMyGov. By opting into this program, you will receive updates or notifications through text message and you will eventually be able to report things to us. Often, there are things that I would like to advise you or remind you of, such as trash delays due to a holiday, weather alerts, etc., that do not require a full-out newsletter. Please note that this DOES NOT replace 911 to get police attention - you still need to call 911 if you need an officer on scene. When messages are sent, they will be during regular business hours.

To get started, text the word "Newport" to 91896.

You will receive a confirmation message asking you to reply YES to verify opt-in. You then get a message to say you have successfully opted in and that frequency of messages will vary. If you text "HELP", you will be provided information about TextMyGov.

If you change your mind, text STOP at any time to remove yourself from the notification list.

This program will expand once I can determine the level of interest based on the number of residents who opt-in.

Meetings: January 21, February 18, March 18

Meetings are being held with social distancing, mask-wearing and limited capacity.

The municipal building will be closed January 21, 2021, and January 22, 2021, because of renovations happening in the office area.

FY2021 General Operating Budget was passed at the December, 2020, meeting of the Mayor and Commissioners.

Breakdown is as follows:

This does not include police grants, pay duty, and pass-through expenses/revenue.
